

## Quiz Competition

Library Programme of TEF has started 2nd round of Quiz Competition 2019. The competition covers half the syllabus of 6 subjects from Grade-VIII. There will be 1400 students from 33 schools participating in it, and 110+ students to be given prizes based on their excellent performance.

## Spelling Bee Contest

ELP organized its 1st contest in TEF's 2 core schools: Khanwah Ghalwan and Amina Girls Higher Secondary School for grade-VI on Dec 9th and 10th, 2019. Total of 78 students participated in the contest showing 63% result in which 22 students secured 100% marks. Prizes were distributed among 11 students based on their excellent performance. The internationally accepted standards were followed and students' response was overwhelming. ELP also plans to expand the contest in large number of schools to bring out more speller.
